- Transferred by U.S. Army to Letterkenny Army Depot (LEAD), (Franklin County), August, 1984.
- Prior to reporting for duty at LEAD, I meritoriously served three-years as an Assistant to the Inspector General (IG) – Lead Logistics Inspector, U.S. Army Western Command (WESCOM), Ft. Shafter, HI.

- Served 3-years on active duty with the U.S. Army Depot Systems Command (DESCOM).
- Served the Commanding General, DESCOM, as a Senior Logistician/Analyst/Trainer.

- After retirement, I worked as a Senior Logistics Systems Functional Analyst/Trainer for various federal government contractors, until October 2004.
- My wife is a wonderful homemaker, and a great cook.

- Being this near to such a potentially hazardous and toxin-producing plant is of great concern to my wife and me.
- Why? Because my wife has a medical condition that could cause her undue stress and inconvenience, during any false or real emergency evacuation.
- I live, work, play, and conduct business – all normally within a 10-mile radius of CVBP. The proposed Ethanol plant will always be a constant and direct threat to the quality of my life, and that of my family, friends, visitors, and neighbors.
- I vote, and pay taxes to the Federal Government, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Franklin County, CASD, and too many others to mention.
- I am a member of the Citizens for a Quality Environment because I believe in their cause in opposition to the proposed Ethanol plant at CVBP, and anywhere in Franklin County, PA.
- We chose to remain in Franklin County after retirement because my children had assimilated to the community, and liked living here. Also, we enjoy the peace, tranquility, and natural beauty of Cumberland Valley, and its surrounding areas.
- When we built our property it was not with the hopes that an Ethanol plant, or similar environmentally unfriendly business would someday be our neighbor.
- I support reasonable, responsible, environmentally safe, non-hazardous, non-polluting, non-toxic, and non-disruptive business development in Franklin County. Failure to meet any of these criteria will result in my steadfast opposition.
